

## When should I use Activities or Posts?

Why Activities?	Why Posts?
<p>Use Activities to centrally assign, collect, and assess student work.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Teacher-driven</li> <li>✓ Ideal for <b>scheduling and organizing assessments</b> (similar to traditional "assignments")</li> <li>✓ Track and assess student submissions and provide feedback using the Activity Quick Review Table or the Proficiency Table</li> <li>✓ Activities will live in an Activity Portal (meaning you can reuse them in future classes)</li> <li>✓ Provide flexibility with resubmission and lock features</li> </ul>	<p>Use Posts to quickly capture evidence of learning or share content in the moment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Teacher <i>and</i> student-driven</li> <li>✓ Ideal for <b>immediate communication and documentation of student learning</b></li> <li>✓ Easily share information and announcements</li> <li>✓ Create Posts for one, multiple, or all students               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Class Posts are shared by all students associated with the Post - encourage discussion among students through comments and reactions</li> <li>✓ 1:1 and Group Posts create a copy for each student/group associated with the Post and can be individually customized once posted</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Assign start dates and due dates (and schedule in future)	✓	✗
Monitor submissions	✓	✗
Add to the GrowthBook (proficiency-based gradebook)	✓	✗
Apply Curriculum Tags and Proficiencies	✓	✓
Submit on behalf of multiple students with a single Post	✗	✓
Instantly publish student and teacher Posts	✗	✓
